
Business event venues

The city's population of 1.69 million people contributes nearly 38 per cent of the national gross domestic product, bringing together numerous world-leading multinationals with New Zealand market leaders across industries such as food and beverage, information and technology (ICT), life sciences, banking and accounting, insurance, hospitality, screen and creative, tourism, education, retail, and transport and logistics. Auckland is the heart of the New Zealand food and beverage industry, both in processing and wholesaling, and is known globally for its highquality products, often with a focus on natural ingredients (just try our handcrafted cheeses or mānuka honey).

Our international reputation for boat building and precision engineering is second to none, and many companies are now producing innovative leadingedge products, from digital media to medical devices.



New Zealand's centre of knowledge and skills

Business innovation starts with new ideas, new research, and an ever-growing pool of talent. Auckland is home to over half of New Zealand's innovation-led advanced industries, and the city is powered by a tech-savvy and highly skilled workforce.

As a business-friendly and innovation-oriented city with a growing and highly diverse population, Auckland is home to three well-established universities, including The University of Auckland, New Zealand's pre-eminent research-led institution. The University of Auckland specialises in areas such as biosciences and advanced materials, and ranks among the world's top 100 universities. Majestic volcanic islands and cosy coves, crashing surf and gentle waves, hidden waterfalls and clifftop vineyards – Tāmaki Makaurau Auckland is the perfect place to play.

In the west, lush native forest plunges down the hills to meet the sea on dramatic blacksand beaches, while the east's sheltered golden-sand beaches are fringed with red-flowering Pohutukawa trees. To the north, the rolling hills of wine country meet stunning coastlines and to the south are picturesque country gardens, unspoiled forests and tranquil bays.

Explore the islands of the Hauraki Gulf, many of them just a short ferry ride away. Sample awardwinning wines at some of the 30 boutique wineries on Waiheke Island, soak up magnificent 360-degree views of Auckland from the summit of Rangitoto Island, the youngest of the region's 48 volcanic cones. Take a scenic helicopter flight for a truly VIP experience.

Blessed with a rich natural environment, Auckland chefs make the most of fresh, seasonal produce, and natural ingredients from the land, sea and rivers. Our succulent seafood is unrivalled, celebrating the best of our place in the Pacific.

Dine overlooking the water at one of many harbourside restaurants, at a hip eatery in the eclectic Britomart or Federal Street precincts, or join the locals in stylish Ponsonby. Move onto a New Zealand-made craft beer or cocktails at a rooftop bar in the heart of the city. For a special day out, take a guided tour of some of Auckland's best foodie destinations, stock up on artisan food products at the weekend farmers' markets, or visit an oyster farm to collect oysters straight from the water and learn how to 'shuck' your own. A wine tour in one of Auckland's three wine regions is one of the most popular choices for business event guests, combining gorgeous scenery with internationally acclaimed wines.

Unique art and culture

Auckland is an incredibly diverse city, home to more than 220 cultures from around the world, creating a multitude of exciting and enriching experiences.

Auckland's Polynesian flavour—including its unique Māori culture—is a major attraction for international guests. Māori are the tangata whenua, the indigenous people, of Aotearoa New Zealand, and their culture is unique to our island nation.

Experience a traditional Māori welcome and singing on a marae (a sacred communal meeting space), see intricately carved meeting houses, and enjoy an authentic Hāngi feast cooked in a traditional earth oven. A kapa haka performance incorporates harmonious singing, rhythmic dancing, and the skilled demonstrations of the poi and traditional weaponry, while the haka is a powerful war dance unique to Aoteoroa. Wander through the collections of Māori taonga (treasures) at the Auckland Museum, sail the harbour on a traditional sailing waka, or learn the traditional arts of flax weaving and bone carving under the expert guidance of Māori artists.

Art lovers can join a guided tour of the Auckland Art Gallery Toi o Tāmaki and browse the gallery's 15,000 artworks, ranging from classic masterpieces to some of New Zealand's best contemporary artists. In the beautiful wine region of Matakana, stroll through the sculpture trail at Brick Bay vineyard or the colourful sculpture gardens and galleries at Sculptureum.

There's always time for shopping, whether you've got an hour or a day to spare. Browse the boutiques in the Britomart precinct's beautifully restored historical buildings, home to the flagship stores of New Zealand's top designers and major international labels. Lower Queen Street, running through the centre of the CBD, is home to luxury labels such as Louis Vuitton, Gucci and Dior, while Auckland's waterfront shopping precinct, Commercial Bay, combines quality retail, cafés and restaurants.

On the city fringes, Ponsonby and Parnell both offer designer fashion, footwear and upmarket homewares, while Newmarket's many shops range from classic to quirky. If you're a serious shopper, take a customised shopping tour to find that perfect designer dress or a one-of-a-kind piece of art or jewellery.













Exhilarating adventures



Dive into Auckland's thrilling adventure activities to create unforgettable memories.

Climb up and over the Auckland Harbour Bridge or bungy jump at New Zealand's only ocean-touch bungy. Help sail an America's Cup racing yacht on the Waitematā Harbour or hit the ski slopes any time of year at New Zealand's only indoor snow resort.

Go ziplining high above the treetops on Waiheke Island, or try your hand at archery and clay pigeon shooting in a vineyard (a great team building exercise). Feel the rush of a thrilling jet boat ride, go mountain biking or quad biking through the forest, or rumble around Auckland on the back of a mighty Harley Davidson motorbike.

Head up the Sky Tower, the tallest free-standing building in the Southern Hemisphere, for incredible 360-degree views across the city. If you're brave enough, you can even 'SkyJump' off the tower or 'SkyWalk' around the outside, 192 metres above the ground.



Local initiatives



Tourism New Zealand and Trees That Count have joined forces to make it easier for visitors to create canopies of carbon-sequestering native trees for future generations to enjoy and to support efforts to address climate change. The conservation charity has a vision to help plant 200 million trees across New Zealand.

Trees That Count can plant a native tree for each guest in Auckland's Brookby Wildlife Habitat Project. This revegetation project links together remnant forest areas, increasing the area's biodiversity and providing food for its abundant birdlife, particularly the endangered kākā bird.

OPEN SANCTUARY RESTORATION PROJECT

Auckland's Shakespear Regional Park is an Open Sanctuary – a pest-free haven for native species that has sheltered bays, pastureland, regenerating native forest, and a lookout with breathtaking views.


Join the volunteer programme to replant native forest in gullies and restore wildlife. Assist with pest eradication and restoration of wetlands and forest, work as a farm hand, or help with weeding and planting in the nursery.

HAURAKI GULF MARINE PARK RESTORATION PROJECT

Tīkapa Moana (The Hauraki Gulf) is of cultural and spiritual significance to Auckland, with a rich history of settlement and use since waka (canoes) first navigated its waters.

The Hauraki Gulf Marine Spatial Plan was developed to restore habitats, rebuild depleted fish stocks, remove marine debris and address risks and threats to water quality. Visitors can assist in the restoration of marine habitats such as shellfish beds and reefs and collect marine litter from beaches and coastal waters.





KELMARNA COMMUNITY FARM

Kelmarna Community Farm is a 4.5 acre certified organic garden nestled in the heart of Ponsonby in central Auckland. Guests can take a farm tour to discover more about climate friendly food and sustainability before getting their hands dirty and participating in seed-raising, sowing, planting, weed management, harvesting and composting. After contributing to the community work, groups can enjoy a communal lunch prepared from the garden

PEST FREE KAIPĀTIKI

Based on Auckland's North Shore, the Kaipātiki Project Ecohub facilitates the regeneration of native plants, birds, bugs, fish, streams and estuaries in local reserves and significant ecological areas. Guests can support this work by helping to clear invasive pest plants, clearing rubbish from forests and streams, planting native tress, or working in the native plant nursery.

MILLION METRES

Million Metres is a waterways restoration project that focuses on planting native flora to care for New Zealand's rivers, lakes and streams as well as the species that reside there. Their mission is to restore at least one million metres of waterways across the country. The Plants filter toxic runoff, prevent sediment washing into water, and cool the water by shading it, so aquatic creatures can survive. Guests can join planting days, they are social and active days out in the fresh air with some environmental education thrown in.

Auckland is the most connected city in New Zealand, with regular flights to and from cities across the globe and daily flights to all the country's main centres and popular tourist destinations.

Auckland is approximately an 11-hour direct flight from most places in the Pacific Rim, including Singapore, Hong Kong, Tokyo and the west coast of the USA, and only a three-hour flight to neighbouring Pacific Islands and the eastern seaboard of Australia.

Getting around Auckland

Auckland's compact footprint and accessible transport solutions make it an incredibly easy and enjoyable city to get around. As well as regular buses, trains and ferries, delegates can also choose from taxis, rental cars, electric bikes and scooters, and private limousine services.

An exciting transformational change is under way within Auckland's inner city, with the introduction of the Access for Everyone plan. The plan will foster pedestrian priority, provide healthier, safer and more equitable public transport options, and create inviting green spaces that everyone can enjoy.

Widening of footpaths, strategically located mobility parking and safer transport methods will provide improved access for those with limited accessibility and disabilities.

A Zero Emissions Area (ZEA) is also being developed to create improved air quality and reduction of emissions through the removal of fossil fuelled vehicles and the introduction of lower or no emissions public transport vehicles. The aim is for Auckland to have the cleanest air of any million-plus city in the world.



Useful travel information

Climate and seasonality

Auckland enjoys a temperate climate. Daytime temperatures range from 20° to 30° Celsius (60° to 86° Fahrenheit) during the warmer seasons (November to March), and from 10° to 17° Celsius (50° to 63° Fahrenheit) in the cooler seasons (April to October).

Concierge service

Auckland Airport offers a professional concierge service to ensure your keynote speakers or delegates enjoy a smooth arrival into the region. Services can include collection from the terminal, assistance with duty free shopping and baggage collection, guidance through border control, priority service at passport control, and the arrangement of onward transport. For an unforgettable welcome, a traditional Māori welcome for your group can also be arranged.

Currency

New Zealand dollars (\$) and cents (c). There are five notes (\$5, \$10, \$20, \$50, \$100) and five coins (10c, 20c, 50c, \$1, \$2).

📀 Electricity

240 V, 50 Hz, with Australian/New Zealand pattern three-pin sockets.

Driving

Drive on the left side of the road in New Zealand. All drivers, including visitors from other countries, must carry their licence or permit at all times when driving. Delegates will only be able to drive the same type of vehicles they are licensed to drive in their home country.

Emergency services

111 is the emergency phone number for police, fire and ambulance services.

😣 Goods and Services Tax (GST)

New Zealand has a 15 per cent GST. Overseas visitors cannot claim this back. Some stores may waive GST if delegates show onward or return air tickets, or when international shipment of goods is arranged.

🕅 Health

Public and private hospitals provide a high standard of treatment and care. Medical services are not free to visitors, so travel insurance that covers medical and health is recommended.

Languages

English is the everyday language in New Zealand, with Māori and New Zealand Sign Language also official languages.



📙 Mobile telephones

Like most countries, New Zealand operates on a 900 or 1800 MHz network. However, some mobiles cannot use international roaming on this frequency. Delegates may buy or rent a New Zealand-compatible phone or sim card upon arrival.

🔒 Safety and security

New Zealand is generally a very safe place to travel, with a relatively low crime rate. However, it is advisable to observe the same precautions with your personal safety and your possessions as you would in any other country or at home. New Zealand is a democratic and politically stable country.



Normal shopping hours from Monday to Saturday are 9am-5pm; some stores and malls have longer opening hours and late nights. Malls and major shopping areas are usually open normal hours on Sundays; shops in some smaller retail areas may be closed.

🕙 Smoke-free policies

In New Zealand it is illegal to smoke indoors. Cigarettes cannot be sold to anyone under 18.

🕑 Time zone

New Zealand Standard Time is 12 hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT). Daylight saving runs from the end of September until early April, when the clocks advance by one hour—it then becomes GMT +13 hours.

逆 Tipping and service charges

Tipping is not expected in New Zealand but delegates may wish to tip for special service or kindness.

O SITE Visitor information

i-SITE is New Zealand's official visitor information centre network with more than 80 i-SITEs nationwide, including locations in Auckland. i-SITEs provide free expert local knowledge and services including itinerary planning and nationwide accommodation and activity bookings.

Visas

Travellers from over 60 countries do not require a visitor's visa for stays of less than three months. For further information visit immigration.govt.nz.
